 - c. What are the implications for HR professionals?
- Be written in simple and clear language, understandable to a general readership
- Contain between 400-450 words. References are not required
- Word format, 12-point Times New Roman font
- Links to surveys are permitted
- Brief bios (10 words or less) should also be attached.
